SDA ORANGE COUNTY CHAPTER HISTORY

(From ASA to SAA to SDA)

SDA Orange County Chapter – Organized July 1973; Reorganized 1983

Organized in 1973, the original chapter was called the Architectural Secretaries Association (ASA), Orange County Chapter. The following are remembrances of Kathleen Flanagan, the first chapter president, who was with Thomas/Richardson Associates:

"We organized in the early 70s, when Thelma Imschwiler and Rosemary Baker came to Orange County from the ASA Los Angeles Chapter, wanting to start a second chapter. L.A. was the first in California, having organized in the '60's.

We met at Corporate Plaza 2, I think, at the entrance to Fashion Island, in an architect's office. I was voted the first president. We then started meeting at the Saddleback Inn in Santa Ana.

We invited our architect bosses to a couple of meetings and enlisted their help to pay memberships and subsidize trips to our conventions, held in concert with AIA conventions. We were able to piggyback with their tours of the area of the convention."

Reorganized in 1983 - It is unknown how long the original chapter lasted. However, the seed was sown and within a few years, the need for a new chapter arose. Geri Eckner and Betsy Nickless, both of Carl McLarand Associates, Inc., were the co-founders of the current Orange County Chapter of the SDA. Geri had heard about the ASA Chapter in Los Angeles and had them come down to OC to talk about the organization in 1982. Geri and Betsy started the OC Chapter in 1982, but did not get official "charter" status until 1983, under the ASA name.

In the early '80s, the chapter meetings were held in the evenings, usually at the AIA office, located in South Coast Village in Santa Ana. Geri Eckner was the first president of the newly reorganized group, followed by Betsy Nickless. The first few years were challenging, but with their wonderful guidance and great leadership, the fledgling chapter gained exposure and with that, new members.

Over the years, the organization changed names – from Architectural Secretaries Association to Society for Architectural Administrators to Society of Design Administration to the current Society for Design Administration!

So, too, has our chapter progressed through the years, from meetings after work at the AIA office in South Coast Village, we changed to a combination of lunchtime brown-bag meetings, with some evening meetings, at the new AIA office by Noguchi Garden in Costa Mesa. Gradually, we began to have food brought in for the lunch seminars. Eventually we moved to having lunchtime meetings/seminars at local restaurants and met for several years at the Wyndham Hotel in Costa Mesa. Beginning in 2013, the chapter's educational programs have been held at the Lutron Event Center in Irvine, Calif.

The potluck Holiday Party, with the installation of officers and the fun ornament exchange, was started by Geri Eckner in the late'80s and has been a long-standing tradition among members.

Our chapter has grown from a few hearty souls with the conviction to share the SDA experience with others, to becoming one of the largest chapters in this National organization! We are proud that our leadership has encouraged members to become active participants at both the local and national levels. The Orange County Chapter has among its members past National Presidents Betsy Nickless, CDFA and Natalie Newman; a former Executive Director of the AIA, Past President of the SDA and Honorary AIA OC member, Connie McKenna-McCulloch; and the 2008 Lifetime Achievement Winner, Betsy Nickless, CDFA.

We have dared to expand our horizons through education, networking, and being very involved in our community. The Orange County Chapter has not only volunteered for numerous years at the AIA Design Awards and the Annual AIA Golf Tournament, but our association grew to include attendance at the AIA OC Board meetings. Among our accomplishments we count the following:

- Hosted "Newly Licensed Architects" receptions,
- Held a "Design A Better Birdhouse" competition for architects,
- Sponsored an SDA Open House and hosted a reception at The Museum of Architecture.
- Working with The Architecture Foundation of Orange County (TAF), the SDA OC worked towards the creation of the *Exploring Orange County Architecture Coloring Book*, first published in 1994 and now in its 3rd edition.
- Members volunteered every year from 1992 2014 (the final year) at HomeAid Orange County's Project Playhouse event and even hosted a Coloring Contest (based on the TAF/SDA book) for three years.
- We have gone on tours to architecturally inspired places (The Performing Arts Center, South Coast Repertory, Pasadena Home Tour and The Getty Museum to name a few).
- Some members have worked as docents for the AIA's Art & Architecture Home Tours and also at the Design Home event.
- Nine years participation as a hosting organization of Canstruction.

CHAPTER HIGHLIGHTS

^{680s} The first meeting was held in January of 1983. Seminars were usually held at the AIA Orange County Chapter office, located in South Coast Village in Santa Ana, or the Hungry Tiger Restaurant. Meetings switched between lunches (bring your own brown bag; cost for meeting and a drink - \$1.00) and after work (cheese, crackers & wine provided) in an effort to appeal to a broader group. With exposure through the AIA newsletter and ads in the local newspaper, we gained new members.

A California ASA one-day conference in Long Beach was held in the late '80s, with Mark Victor Hansen as our speaker.

Geri and Art Eckner started the tradition of a holiday brunch at their house in early December in '86 or '87. It grew to include a buffet brunch, the installation of officers for the upcoming year and the ever popular ornament exchange.

Since the late '80s, SAA/SDA members have volunteered for a variety of industry-related yearly events, such as the AIA Design Awards, AIA Golf Tournaments, Art & Architecture Home Tours and HBC Casino Night parties. In addition, many members have volunteered time at the SDA Booth and/or assisted at Canstruction displays during National Conventions for many years.

'90s Lunch meetings were now the norm, with an occasional evening event, and were held at the new AIA OC Chapter office in the Great Western Bank Tower, by the Noguchi Gardens, in Costa Mesa. General meetings were \$5.00. We slowly transitioned to bringing food in and raising the price of seminars to \$10.00. By 1998, we began having the general meetings at the Wyndham Hotel, where lunch was \$15.00 and parking was free.

In the early '90s, the officers and board of directors would meet at 7:30 a.m. at Coco's or Ruby's to hold our business meetings. As the chapter grew, we found we couldn't cover everything in that short amount of time (and still get to work), and so began our tradition of holding evening business meetings once a month at rotating offices (conference rooms and a light meal offered by members). These meetings are now open to all SDA members as well.

Three monetary awards were given one to each of the three of the participants! Unfortunately, there was not a lot of participation on the part of the AIA, but this provided fun memories over the years for those involved.

Participated in the first ever HomeAid Orange County Project Playhouse event in Newport Beach. SAA members, friends, and family volunteered several weekends, plus worked the last shift of the last day of the event, followed by the Auction Party, which has become a tradition for us. HomeAid has recognized our chapter volunteers over the years in their printed playhouse catalogs and with letters of appreciation. This event is our chapter outreach program to our local community. Funds raised from Project Playhouse help give hope and shelter to the transitionally homeless in Orange County.

1993 Sponsored the Newly Licensed Architects Reception, April 22, 1993 at the AIA OC Chapter office.

Gena Hester became the Coloring Book Committee Co-Chair in July for what would become the *Exploring Orange County Architecture Coloring Book*.

1994 *Exploring Orange County Architecture Coloring Book* was first published as a joint effort of the SAA OC and TAFOC (The Architecture Foundation of Orange County). The first edition was dedicated to the memory of two extraordinary individuals, Kathie Davis, Honorary AIA and Director of the AIA OC and Art Eckner, a warm and inspiring architect and late husband of SAA OC Co-founder, Geri Eckner. Proceeds, if any, from the sale of the coloring book will be used to provide architecture-related educational and awareness opportunities and support for young people from Orange County.
